14 have our new Board. If I may briefly adjust the agenda, I
15 would like to--

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Before you go any further,
17 Bruce, I would like to make a statement that the
18 committees will be giving out, and you will be assigned
19 the committees. And preferably, keep them as they were,
20 but maybe a few minor changes.

21 MS. BAILEY: Okay.

22 MR. WARD: Okay. I would like to read
23 resolution 5 G at this time. It is a resolution of the
24 Board. I will read this into the record.

25 Whereas, the Board of Directors and the

1 staff of the the Atlantic City Municipal Utilities
2 Authority remain devastated by the recent tragic passing
3 of our beloved co-worker and dearest friend, Demond T.
4 Tally, and

5 Whereas, Demond was a long time resident of
6 Atlantic City and 1962 graduate of Egg Harbor Township
7 High School, and

8 Whereas, Demond joined the staff of the
9 Atlantic City Municipal Utilities Authority in October of
10 2011 at the entry position of Laborer I, and

11 Whereas, Demond quickly recognized the
12 opportunity to build a career in the water industry and
13 began the quest to study and qualify for upper ranks, and

14 Whereas, Demond enrolled for coursework
15 which he attended after work hours and passed the
16 certifying examination for Water Repairer in 2014, and

17 Whereas, as Water Repairer, Demond became
18 the Authority's lead staff member to install and adjust
19 water meters to function effectively with the Authority's
20 wireless computerized billing systems, and

21 Whereas, Demond continued his studies at
22 Rowan College and successfully completed the Advanced
23 Water Operations Parts I and II program in December 2018,
24 and

25 Whereas, following his Advanced Water

1 Operations Certification less than sixty days ago, Demond
2 was scheduled to begin his new assignment of Water
3 Operator Apprentice beginning March 1, 2019, and

4 Whereas, while it was well known throughout
5 the Authority that Demond was a "Rising Star," Demond was
6 well liked by all and exemplified the model of a team
7 player and friend, and

8 Whereas, Demond's prior volunteer service
9 as a Coach to youth football laid a broad foundation
10 toward his affection for his community and his embracing
11 character, and

12 Whereas, the entire Atlantic City Municipal
13 Utilities family will sadly miss his kind and enduring
14 smile he gave unconditionally day after day.

15 Now therefore, The Atlantic City Municipal
16 Utilities Authority joins with the greater Atlantic City
17 community to extend our heartfelt condolences to the
18 family of Demond T. Tally and extend our wish for comfort
19 and care during your time of grief and sorrow, and

20 Furthermore be it resolved, it is our wish
21 that the life of Demond T. Tally shall serve as a beacon
22 for the youth and families of the Atlantic City community
23 to strive for excellence and compassion in all you desire
24 to achieve and to do so with love of life and concern for
25 your neighbor as Demond so gracefully demonstrated for

1 all.

2 Upon Motion, This Resolution was Approved
3 as read.

4 Obviously we are saddened by the loss of
5 Demond. This resolution will be read tonight at the City
6 Counsel meeting which is scheduled tonight.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, did his family-- his
8 family has been notified already--

9 MR. WARD: His family will get--

10 THE CHAIRMAN: They have been notified
11 already, haven't they? At the funeral the resolution was
12 given?

13 MR. WARD: The resolution was not read at
14 the funeral.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay.

16 MR. WARD: The funeral services were
17 Islamic services and did not add that period. They are
18 not allowed that period. So the resolution--

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Well, I assumed at the
20 funeral he had-- it was-- because you had come up to get
21 it signed--

22 MR. WARD: Right. I was trying to get it
23 started--

24 THE CHAIRMAN: Right.

25 MR. WARD: -- very quickly. I called the

1 board members so that we were moving it. And I understand
2 that his family will be at City Counsel tonight. So we
3 will have our resolution prepared and ready for them.

4 Also, during this period of bereavement, I
5 would like to share with you the note of sympathy and
6 thanks from Kate Colanzi that she sent to acknowledge the
7 well wishes from the Board.

8 Okay. Just a couple of announcements.
9 There is an association for environmental authorities
10 conference coming up on March the 12th to the 13th. Are
11 there any board members that wish to attend?

12 MS. BAILEY: Where is it located?

13 MR. WARD: I am thinking it is going to
14 be-- it is at one of the casinos.

15 THE BOARD MEMBER: Caesars.

16 MR. WARD: Caesars. So any board member
17 that is interested, please let us know and we will get
18 your ticket and everything done.

19 Okay. So I guess we are at 5 D.
20 Resolution 5 D which would be the Schedule of Meetings for
21 the 2019 year. We give our thanks to Mrs. Kelley Williams
22 who put all of this together.

23 MR. HILL: I make a motion to accept.

24 MS. BAILEY: I second.

25 THE CHAIRMAN: It can be-- excuse me, Gary.

1 It can be changed.

2 MR. HILL: Right, at our discretion.

3 MR. WARD: If there is a situation where
4 you have to change it.

5 MR. HILL: Right.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: I second it.

7 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

9 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

10 MR. HILL: Yes.

11 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

12 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

13 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

14 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

15 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

16 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

17 MR. WARD: Cash Management Plan. Attached,
18 this is a formality that we submit to the City Clerk in
19 our cash management process. Is there a motion?

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Move it.

21 MR. HILL: Second.

22 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

23 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

24 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

25 MR. HILL: Yes.

1 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

2 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

3 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

4 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

5 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

6 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

7 MR. WARD: And 5 F would be Committee
8 Meetings. And as the Chair indicated, we will have some
9 followup to the committee assignments and the meetings, of
10 course, while they are scheduled ahead of time, we can
11 always move dates around if necessary.

12 MR. HILL: So we are not voting on that.

13 MR. WARD: We are not voting on that.

14 MR. HILL: Right, correct.

15 MR. WARD: That is just a information item.

16 The minutes of the Personnel Committee
17 Meeting was attached, no adjustments. The Engineering
18 Committee Meeting did not provide a memorandum, but
19 Mr. Smith is here. And if there is any questions on what
20 was covered at the Engineering Committee Meeting, we can
21 make that clear. There are also financial reports and
22 shut offs.

23 MR. HILL: Mr. Ward, just a minute. Why
24 don't we take care of our public participant before we get
25 into all this.

1 THE CHAIRMAN: That's my fault. I'm sorry.
2 I did not realize we had a gentleman sitting back there.

3 MR. WARD: And your name, sir?

4 MR. HEM: Gary Hem, 120 North
5 Massachusetts.

6 MR. WARD: Mr. Hem at-- Gary and Patricia
7 Hem. Good morning, Sir.

8 MR. HEM: Good morning. How are you doing?

9 MR. WARD: Okay. Mr. Hem has resolution
10 10--

11 MR. HILL: Yes.

12 MR. WARD: -- A 3. And he is seeking an
13 abatement in the amount of \$822.39.

14 Mr. Hem, did you have a leakage at your
15 property?

16 MR. HEM: Yes.

17 MR. WARD: Was it repaired by a plumber?

18 MR. HEM: Yes.

19 MR. WARD: Was this is first abatement that
20 you have requested?

21 MR. HEM: Yes, sir.

22 MR. WARD: Any questions from the Board?

23 THE CHAIRMAN: Move it.

24 MR. HILL: Second.

25 MR. RILEY: Okay. Mr. Smith.

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

2 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

3 MR. HILL: Yes.

4 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

5 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

6 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

7 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

8 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

9 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

10 MR. WARD: Okay, sir. Your abatement is
11 approved. And you will get notice from our billing
12 department on how your abatement credit will be managed
13 with respect to you going forward with the bills.

14 MR. HEM: Okay. Thank you.

15 MR. WARD: You are welcome.

16 MR. HEM: Thank you, sir.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: It was not that hard, was
18 it?

19 MR. WARD: Okay.

20 MR. HILL: We have two that did not appear.

21 MR. WARD: We have two that did not appear;
22 Dekbon and Nquyen. I understand from Kelley one is on
23 their way.

24 MR. HILL: So we will do them later when
25 they get here, okay.

1 MR. WARD: We have two more information
2 items before we move on. That is association of
3 alternatives. Justin Purdom, operator apprentice has been
4 appointed to a licensed operator, grade six. Justin
5 started here on the labor team and he moved up in terms of
6 licensing and so forth and so on. So he moves ahead as a
7 operator.

8 I will be doing a bankruptcy presentation
9 for the New Jersey Bar Association Conference which will
10 be April the 4th. The bankruptcy presentation is the
11 second part of the one that we attended with Judge
12 Gambardella. So it is talking about whether or not
13 Atlantic City's struggle with real estate taxes can
14 survive a bankruptcy in the State of New Jersey. And I am
15 also going to be doing a guest lecture on water for
16 Richard Stockton University.

17 The other thing is-- no, that's going to go
18 in closed session. So we are going to come back to that,
19 okay.

20 MR. HILL: Mr. Ward.

21 MR. WARD: Yes.

22 MR. HILL: Can we go back to engineering
23 for a minute?

24 MR. WARD: Yes.

25 MR. HILL: Are we-- is this the right time?

1 MR. WARD: Sure.

2 MR. HILL: We had a very-- Mrs. Langford
3 and I were at the Engineering Meeting on the 29th. We had
4 a very long agenda. And I saw a lot of those items are
5 coming through this agenda.

6 I would just check with Mr. Smith. Is
7 there anything you wanted to add since that meeting?
8 There were some minor issues we were trying to get ahead
9 of, the Van Nest Park thing, the--

10 MR. SMITH: Well, the--

11 MR. HILL: For the rest of the Board's
12 information.

13 MR. SMITH: Sure. The Van Nest project is
14 still in progress right now. We are still waiting on some
15 permit from the state to give us approval to move ahead.
16 So far we have not received that particular permit. So it
17 is still in the work in process stage.

18 As soon as we can receive that particular
19 permit, then we can start planning the schedule for when
20 we will probably put that particular project out for
21 construction. So it's just a matter of time. As you know
22 at this state, you can't always push that too much in
23 regards to getting things done. Like I said, we are
24 waiting on that particular permit, okay?

25 MR. HILL: What about the Caesars thing?

1 MR. SMITH: That I'm not quite sure about
2 because Kendall was actually working on that.

3 MR. HILL: That's right.

4 MR. SMITH: So it's still pretty much as is
5 right now.

6 MR. HILL: Okay.

7 MR. SMITH: Okay. The Annual Engineer
8 Report, we just received a draft of that. That will be
9 reviewed. Upon finished review, then we will actually go
10 into the final publication of that. Hopefully that will
11 be in the next, probably, two weeks.

12 So by the next board meeting, that should
13 be completed, okay? And that's needed also for part of
14 our audit that's going on as well. So we need to get that
15 done as soon as possible.

16 MR. HILL: Okay.

17 MR. SMITH: Do you want me to talk about
18 the roof or do you want to wait until we get to--

19 MR. HILL: No. That's on the agenda.
20 Okay. Thank you.

21 MR. WARD: Okay. Number 7, Directors
22 Forum. Any items?

23 MR. HILL: I just have one. I would like
24 to welcome Mr. McGettigan back. It is so good to see you
25 with us.

1 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

2 THE CHAIRMAN: That goes double for me,
3 John. One other thing I would like to address to the
4 Board and the Board Members; each and everyone of us have
5 the same powers as when discussing the business.

6 Now, something has come up that has been
7 bothering me for a month. And I asked Mr. Riley to find
8 the legal ramifications of if a board member is out sick
9 and doesn't attend the meetings, can he be transferred to
10 an alternate or maintain the status as a Board Member.

11 Now, I'm saying that because that applies
12 to me, that applies to every Board Member. And I just
13 want the real legal process on that because it hit me in a
14 way that I didn't like. A man out on a sickbed, and he is
15 being taken from being a board member, and turned into a
16 alternate. And that's not to cast any aspersions on
17 anybody, it is not about that. It is about doing the
18 right thing.

19 MS. BAILEY: Yes, we all agree. I think we
20 all agree.

21 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes. That is all I am
22 saying. And I do not want to try to bring up some kind of
23 confrontation, that it has to be in that paper, this, that
24 and the other thing. This is amongst the Board Members in
25 the MUA. I want to know what the procedure is.

1 And I know you don't know exactly what I am
2 talking about with--

3 MR. RILEY: No, I know what you are talking
4 about.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: So, I mean, I will give you
6 some time, Mike, to find out what the legal--

7 MR. RILEY: That's a fair request.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Because it has been
9 bothering me. And I just don't roll like that. I don't
10 do things like that. So if you could give that to me--
11 not to me, but the whole Board--

12 MR. RILEY: I will.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: -- as soon as you can. And
14 it is no rush.

15 MR. RILEY: No problem.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: And John, I am not trying to
17 overstep my boundaries because you have already told me
18 your opinion about things. And that's why I asked you
19 first before I said anything.

20 MS. BAILEY: Let me ask you something. As
21 Chair, Mr. Smith, how does certain actions take place, as
22 Chair, without your knowledge?

23 THE CHAIRMAN: Because it happened. I
24 would like to know that also.

25 MR. HILL: That's a good question.

1 THE CHAIRMAN: The thing is, I was
2 approached-- and I don't want to cast, like I said, any
3 aspersions on anybody-- as to when John was coming back.
4 And I made mention to the Executive Director that John
5 would be back in February. I met John--

6 MR. WARD: The Executive Director?

7 THE CHAIRMAN: You. I'm talking about you.

8 MR. WARD: Okay.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: I told you that John would
10 be back in February when I met him at Shoprite. And it
11 shocked me because I thought I saw a ghost.

12 I walked up to him I said, "John, how are
13 you?" And he explained to me. And I said, "Well, how are
14 you making out?" And he told me that he would be back to
15 work in February. And I said, "Then take your time
16 because there is no rush. Health is more important than
17 anything else as far as I am concerned."

18 But I am just saying that if-- I am old. I
19 am much older than John. I get sick. I don't expect
20 somebody to take my job away from me and benefits. You
21 know, that I have been here for twenty years. And I am
22 not blowing a lot of smoke.

23 I have only missed three meetings the whole
24 time. I have been fortunate. And one of them was when my
25 wife passed. That was the only time I missed a meeting.

1 But I have been fortunate enough to have fairly decent
2 health.

3 MS. BAILEY: Thank goodness. Thank
4 goodness.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: And that comes to mind.

6 MR. RILEY: No problem.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Okay. Thanks.

8 MS. BAILEY: Thank you.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Thanks, Michael.

10 MR. WARD: Okay. This will be-- good
11 morning. Your name, Ma'am?

12 MS. CAMPBELL: Brittany Campbell.

13 MR. WARD: Brittany Campbell, you are from
14 Dekbon?

15 MS. CAMPBELL: Dekbon, yes.

16 MR. WARD: Community Development. You are
17 asking for an abatement of \$784.04. Ma'am, was there a
18 leak at this property?

19 MS. CAMPBELL: Yes.

20 MR. WARD: And was it repaired by a
21 plumber?

22 MS. CAMPBELL: Yes.

23 MR. WARD: Is this the first request for an
24 abatement?

25 MS. CAMPBELL: Yes.

1 MR. WARD: Members of the Board, any
2 questions?

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Move it.

4 MS. BAILEY: Move it.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Second.

6 MR. RILEY: Okay. Mr. Smith.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

8 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

9 MR. HILL: Yes.

10 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

11 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

12 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

13 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

14 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

15 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

16 MR. WARD: Okay. Ma'am, your abatement has
17 been approved. And the billing office will be able to
18 stay in touch with you in terms of how the credit will be
19 worked out.

20 MS. CAMPBELL: Okay.

21 MR. WARD: Okay.

22 MS. CAMPBELL: Thank you very much.

23 MS. WILLIAMS: Can I say something?

24 MS. BAILEY: Hm-hmm.

25 MS. WILLIAMS: The last abatement they were

1 not necessary to appear.

2 MR. HILL: Oh, okay. So we can put them
3 with the next group.

4 MS. WILLIAMS: Well, it wasn't necessary.

5 MS. BAILEY: Right.

6 MS. WILLIAMS: They didn't have to come.

7 MR. HILL: No, but didn't we have an
8 unnecessary?

9 MS. BAILEY: So we read them all together.
10 It's the part where we would read them together.

11 MR. HILL: Right, exactly.

12 MR. WARD: Okay. I guess we are at old
13 business, 9 A 1.

14 MR. HILL: That's the only one we have.

15 MR. WARD: Oh, I'm sorry.

16 MR. HILL: That's all right, Bruce. We did
17 not approve that.

18 MS. WILLIAMS: Right.

19 MR. HILL: Right. That's what I'm saying.

20 MS. BAILEY: So--

21 MR. HILL: So we should go back and-- I'm
22 not trying to-- I'm just saying.

23 MS. BAILEY: No. I understand what you are
24 saying, but there were other ones. We regrouped them
25 together.

1 MR. HILL: Right, but we don't have any
2 other ones.

3 MS. BAILEY: Oh, that's the only one we
4 had. Gotcha.

5 MR. HILL: That's what she is saying. So
6 we should go and do that one is what I'm--

7 MS. BAILEY: I gotcha.

8 MR. WARD: Old business, 9 A 1.

9 MS. BAILEY: Approve it.

10 MR. HILL: Let's just approve that. I want
11 to try to get it out of the way.

12 MR. HILL: I'll move 10 A 2 on necessary to
13 appear, that abatement.

14 MS. BAILEY: Okay. And I second.

15 MR. HILL: Second. There we go.

16 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

18 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

19 MR. HILL: Yes.

20 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

21 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

22 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

23 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

24 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

25 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

1 MR. WARD: All right. Now we are at old
2 business, 9 A 1. Transcription stenographer services,
3 resolution 9 A 1.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Move it.

5 MR. HILL: Second.

6 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

8 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

9 MR. HILL: Yes.

10 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

11 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

12 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

13 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

14 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

15 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

16 MR. WARD: 9 B 1, to accept bids from
17 Carmeuse Lime and Stone, Incorporated, for high calcium
18 hydrated lime. 9 B 1.

19 MS. BAILEY: Motion.

20 MR. HILL: This is the same company we have
21 used before, right?

22 MR. SMITH: Yes.

23 MR. HILL: Okay. Second.

24 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

25 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

1 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

2 MR. HILL: Yes.

3 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

4 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

5 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

6 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

7 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

8 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

9 MR. WARD: 9 C 1, fire hydrants, stainless
10 steel repair clamps, and cast iron fittings.

11 MR. SMITH: This is an amendment.

12 MS. BAILEY: An amendment because there is
13 no bid?

14 MR. HILL: Correct.

15 MR. SMITH: Reason being, the (inaudible)
16 portion of that first bid was not able to supply the
17 specified materials. So we went to the next bidder that
18 actually is supplying the specified items for that
19 particular bid proposal.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Claude, was that a cost
21 overrun?

22 MR. SMITH: It is not a cost overrun. If
23 we knew that they were not going to be supplying the
24 specified item, we would have actually selected the second
25 bid.

1 MR. HILL: Of course.

2 THE CHAIRMAN: Understood. I was just
3 inquiring if it was going to cost us extra money. You
4 know how I am about that.

5 MR. HILL: I'll move 9 C 1.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Second.

7 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

9 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

10 MR. HILL: Yes.

11 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

12 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

13 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

14 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

15 MR. RILEY: Mr. Devlin.

16 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

17 MR. WARD: 9 D 1, engineering report, site
18 visit and roofing project. Mr. Smith.

19 MR. SMITH: We had a conference for the
20 site visit a few weeks ago where the architect actually
21 hosted that particular conference. We had about 14 people
22 in attendance. Of course that doesn't mean that was 14
23 companies, but at least 14 people attended. It went very
24 well. I was impressed at the fact that we did have such a
25 large turn out for this particular project.

1 And there will be an addendum issued.
2 Hopefully it will be issued by tomorrow. And of course,
3 we will be accepting bids in March.

4 MR. WARD: We are hopeful that we can get
5 all of this done because it is an aggressive project to,
6 number one, secure and seal the roof, and also to secure
7 the envelope of the external building.

8 Okay, 10 B.

9 MR. DEVLIN: Can I ask a question for one
10 second?

11 MR. WARD: Yes.

12 MR. DEVLIN: How old is this building?

13 MR. SMITH: 27 years old.

14 MR. DEVLIN: And the roofing project is
15 going to cost-- it has to be sealed. And it's a big
16 process, but what kind of money are we talking?

17 MR. SMITH: It is. I mean, we are having
18 some issues with the roof. In terms of roof leaks, there
19 are some areas that have been compromised based on the
20 seals that we have on the exterior of the building.

21 Especially in the summertime, you know, we
22 tend to have quite a few pipe leaks from condensation
23 within the building. And we have to do that in order to
24 at least get the building back into some sort of good
25 working order. Things do break over a period of time.

1 MR. DEVLIN: What is the total?

2 MR. SMITH: What are we expecting to spend?

3 MR. DEVLIN: Correct.

4 MR. SMITH: Estimated wise, probably
5 talking over \$400,000.

6 MR. DEVLIN: Thank you.

7 MR. WARD: And John, that's going to
8 include a refashioning of a major skylight on the second
9 floor which has failed. And it also includes to seal the
10 exterior of the building because the envelope is failing.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Wasn't that project going to
12 include the panels or is that separate?

13 MR. WARD: The interior panels?

14 THE CHAIRMAN: No, the panels for the
15 solar.

16 MS. BAILEY: No. No they are separate.

17 MR. WARD: Okay. 10 B, request for
18 qualifications/proposals. Let me take you back a bit. We
19 had an announcement for floating solar. We received four
20 qualified bidders. At that time, the board of public
21 utilities had not completed its rule making for aggregate
22 net metering.

23 More recently aggregate net metering is now
24 approved on a pilot and our consultants are saying that we
25 need to go back out because there will be more venders

1 interested in the Floating Solar Project which again, is
2 at the lower reservoir.

3 So this is the resolution to go forward and
4 begin to bring in new venders for floating solar.

5 MS. BAILEY: And this is at the pond? This
6 is the floating solar that we are putting at the--

7 MR. WARD: This will be floating on-- yeah,
8 these will be solar panels that will float on the lower
9 reservoir.

10 MS. BAILEY: Right. Right. I remember.

11 MR. WARD: We have been with floating solar
12 since 2014 and trying to move this project along while we
13 were waiting for the Board of Public Utilities to adjust
14 the rating so that we could do aggregate metering.
15 Because previously you could put your solar panels on
16 there, but you could only sell at whole sale price.

17 Now, at this time, you can get resale price
18 and it makes it much more advantageous for companies to
19 come in. We are actually looking to do probably the
20 largest floating solar in the state. And it will be at no
21 cost to the authority, no cost whatsoever. We do it in
22 the power purchase agreement. And I'll be talking about
23 the successful PPA that we have at the plan now.

24 So this is the direction we need to go in.
25 As you know, we pay a million dollars a year for

1 electricity at the plant in order to pump water over to
2 the city. And we want to address that cost in the most
3 modern, and efficient, and sustainable manner.

4 MR. HILL: I'll move 10 B 1.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Second.

6 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

8 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

9 MR. HILL: Yes.

10 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

11 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

12 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

13 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

14 MR. RILEY: And Mr. Devlin.

15 MR. DEVLIN: Yes.

16 MR. WARD: 10 B 2, vending services at the
17 administration and plant facility. I have to admit that I
18 probably have been struggling with this and thought it
19 wasn't as big a deal. But it is a big deal because there
20 is no contract for the vending services that are here.

21 There are only two machines here, two
22 machines at the plant, but there is no contract. And we
23 definitely need a contract. And the reason why is because
24 I need to have the vender have an insurance policy that
25 covers us. I mean, they come in here with a truck and

1 they push something, knock into somebody or something, you
2 know.

3 MR. HILL: Right. Who is it?

4 MR. WARD: I don't know who they are.

5 MR. HILL: I only know one company, that's
6 why I am asking.

7 MR. WARD: There's a different company at
8 the plant. I mean, it's not a big contract for the
9 vender.

10 MR. HILL: No.

11 MR. WARD: Obviously.

12 MR. HILL: Obviously not.

13 MR. WARD: I mean we only have, you know,
14 twenty something, thirty something employees. And only
15 the blue collar, for the most part, use the vending
16 machines here. People that work upstairs, I doubt if they
17 even go down there, but it is not a big deal. But it is a
18 big deal in terms of liability. And I think what we can
19 do is we could clean that up.

20 MS. BAILEY: Okay. But it will probably be
21 the same people anyway.

22 MR. DEVLIN: They are paying us, correct?

23 MR. WARD: I don't think so. I don't think
24 we are going to be in a position-- I know-- and I don't
25 know--

1 MR. DEVLIN: They use our electric.

2 MR. WARD: Well, I think-- I think the
3 volume of sales is so little that I don't know if we would
4 get-- but see, if we put it out to bid, and if a company
5 thinks they want to come in and give us something, we'll
6 take it. But the piece that I think is really important
7 is the insurance.

8 MR. DEVLIN: Well, I got you on that part.
9 I am just curious. I mean, they are using our electric.

10 MR. WARD: I mean, you know, sometimes when
11 the crews are out in the street and all of the sudden
12 there is a major storm, we have to bring them in. We have
13 to bring them in and you know. Well, now, you know, let's
14 have some lunch and so forth. And I don't know.

15 MS. BAILEY: No, I agree. But at least you
16 can, like Mr. Devlin is saying, you can incorporate some
17 things. We need to talk about that.

18 MR. WARD: Yes. We'll see what we get.

19 MS. BAILEY: I make a motion.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Second.

21 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

22 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

23 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

24 MR. HILL: Yes.

25 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

1 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

2 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

11 MR. HILL: Time wise, right. But no money,
12 no financial at this point.

13 MR. SMITH: There is no money involved in
14 this particular--

15 MR. HILL: They need more time basically.
16 I'll move 10 C 1.

17 MR. RILEY: Is there a second?

18 MS. BAILEY: Second.

19 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

20 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.

21 MR. RILEY: Mr. Hill.

22 MR. HILL: Yes.

23 MR. RILEY: Ms. Bailey.

24 MS. BAILEY: Yes.

25 MR. RILEY: Ms. Langford.

1 MS. LANGFORD: Yes.

6 it looks as though the staff has placed that burden on
7 Bruce Ward.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: I think you skipped one
9 there, Bruce. You skipped one there.

10 MR. WARD: You are right, Mr. Chairman.
11 Well #19 Remedial Action- Quarterly Groundwater
12 Monitoring. I'm sorry. Resolution 10 D 1.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Clarify that a little bit
14 for me. What does that represent?

15 MR. SMITH: This is for a ground water
16 test. And this is an ongoing dilemma basically. This has
17 to do with a spill that occurred at well 19 at the FAA
18 Tech Center Site. It has been going on since 2013.

19 As per the state, we do have to do ground
20 water test work. All the reports and so fourth were
21 completed. And you have 180 days to at least, upon the
22 expiration of, to start doing some form of testing that is
23 done on a quarterly basis.

24 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes, but what I am concerned
25 about that is are we in compliance?

1 MR. SMITH: We will be in compliance if we
2 do the ground water testing. We have to do this.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: And we are doing testing,
4 aren't we?

5 MR. SMITH: Well, we have to approve this
6 in order for the funding to be allocated for this to be
7 done.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Move it.

9 MR. HILL: Second.

10 MR. RILEY: Mr. Smith.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Yes.
